Dear WSDOT and City of Seattle:

The signs around Seattle need to be updated with the correct project cost of \$3.1 billion for the Alaskan Way Viaduct Tunnel Replacement. The difference between the posted project cost of \$1.44 billion and \$3.1 billion is presently only 215%+ greater than the posted project cost. I think the public has a right to be informed that the project cost of \$3.1 billion is significantly greater by a mere \$1.66 Billion.

Below is a picture of one of the inaccurate \$1.44 Billion project cost signs that is posted and located at the south end of the City of Seattle as you head northbound on highway 99:



Let me know if I need to complete a City of Seattle customer service bureau request for new signs through "Find It or Fix It" or if the above request for updated signs will suffice. As always, thank you in advance for your never-ending commitment to keeping the public informed and being accountable and transparent to Seattle, King County, Washington taxpayers.
